


Figure 1. IAUS367 Participants Map. Countries with registered persons are in green.

Total Solar Eclipse

On December 14, 2020, a Total Eclipse of the Sun will travel from west to east over Chile and across the Republic of Argentina, crossing Patagonia. We will invite you to move VIRTUALLY to the sites in Argentina, where the local groups will transmit the event, in Piedra del Aguila (to the West) and Las Grutas (to the East).
